



PRINCIPAL REPORT

Our Year 3 to 6 students are now well and truly settled back into the school environment and very much enjoying school life. It has been great to see the effort they are putting into their learning back on site. I have seen some excellent examples of beautiful book work. The students have adjusted very quickly to the changes following their time of remote learning. Well done students.



School Drop off and Pick Ups

All is going smoothly with the systems that have been put in place thanks to the co-operation of the parents and carers and students. It is great to see the students especially our younger ones, coming in to school so confidently and independently.

I am pleased to say that following lobbying from the school and community the Mornington Shire has now provided a crossing attendant to supervise the Nepean Highway Craigie Road intersection.

A further safety issue that has come to my attention is the foot traffic on the Dunns Road path beyond the roundabout. With the staggered finish times we now have people walking in both directions at the same time. School Camps Cancelled for 2020

During the COVID restrictions school camps could not be held. Our Year 4 Camp did not go ahead in early Term 2 and the Ski Camp which would normally be fully planned by this point in time has also been cancelled. The Combined Schools Art and Music Camps planned for August have also been cancelled. This term as sizeable deposits were due to be paid for the proposed camps for Years 3, 5 and 6, the decision was made to cancel all camps at Osborne for 2020.

The complexity of risk management and safety at camps during these times has led to this decision. I know this is very disappointing for our students but in view of the risks arising through the students living in communal accommodation, the exposure of students to different areas of Melbourne/ Victoria and the difficulties in ensuring safety and wellbeing of students, staff and volunteer parents in the event of an outbreak of COVID, the cancellations have been made.

Today I have visited the classes of all students concerned and I must say how resilient and understanding the students were in regard to this decision.

I am aware that camps will be opening up for business again in the near future but this will not change the decision to cancel all camps for 2020 at Osborne.

We will be investigating some alternate events and activities for the students to continue to engage in learning inside/outside the school environment in place of overnight camps this year. We will keep the community informed regarding these opportunities next term.

Building Program

Stage one is powering along and we are pleased to see internal plaster walls being installed and external cladding now in place for a lot of the building. Everything is on track for completion of this stage of the program by early Term 3.

Assembly

With the current restrictions we are unable to hold our normal assembly but instead have come up with a new system. The school captains Mia and Lucas led a very enjoyable assembly for all classes to view on their big screens via WebEx last Friday. We will continue to offer this type of assembly for the students on Fridays whilst the restrictions on large gatherings are still in place.

Curriculum Corner



The student reports for Semester 1 will be different than our past reporting format. The report will be more heavily weighted towards a progress report rather than the standard achievement report card of past semesters. Due to these changes, the teachers have been involved in a number of professional discussions to ensure they fully understand the new requirements and the essential components for these reports.

In recognition that schools have adopted revised teaching and learning plans for Term 2, the Department has outline 3 requirements that schools must provide:


- a description of the areas of the Victorian Curriculum that have been taught
- a succinct descriptive comment of student learning achievement, based on the Victorian Curriculum F-10
- an indication of how the student has adjusted to the remote and flexible learning environment, with reference to the Personal and Social Capability curriculum.

The Semester 1 report structure will consist of a progression level for English and Mathematics while a general comment will be included for English, Mathematics, Inquiry and Personal development. No Victorian Curriculum levels will be given in this report. The collation of Term 1 onsite and Term 2 remote learning results, work samples, conferencing with students and other assessment tools will all play a crucial role in the forming of an overall view of each student's progress over the semester. As the report writing process takes literary dozens of hours to complete out of school time, I want to thank the teachers for their time and effort.

Reports will be open to parents on Compass at 3:30pm on the Wednesday 24th June.
