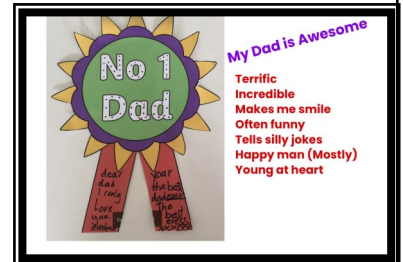
PRINCIPAL REPORT

Thank you to our students and community for their continued efforts with remote and flexible learning. The long awaited announcement from the Premier last Sunday sees the continuation of Stage 4 restrictions until September 28th. The "road map" out of lock down has a three step plan taking us through to late October. This includes the following decisions by the Victorian Government about school operations.

- All schools will continue to provide remote and flexible learning for the remainder of Term 3 except specialist schools in rural and regional Victoria, consistent with current settings.
- The first week of Term 4, 5th-9th October remote and flexible learning will continue for all students, except in specialist schools in rural and regional Victoria.
- On-site supervision for children of permitted workers and vulnerable students will continue to be provided consistent with existing guidelines.
- From October 12th students in Prep to Grade 2 in metropolitan Melbourne return to full-time on-site schooling.
- Remote and flexible learning will continue for all students in Grade 3 to Year 10, other than for children of permitted workers and vulnerable students. A date for the return of these year levels to face-to-face learning will be subject to further health advice.

The Education Department will be providing further materials for communication to parents and carers shortly. I will keep families updated through Compass as further information comes to hand.

We very much look forward to the time when all of our students are able to attend school onsite. The disappointment our students and families may be feeling at this time with the extension of Stage 4 is acknowledged by the leadership and staff at Osborne. We will continue to make every effort to provide stimulating learning and a high level of support for students' learning and wellbeing needs. This week Student/Parent/ Teacher conferences
