## **Cross Country**

Last week, the whole school participated in Cross Country. It was a really fun event. I was super impressed with all of our students (from P to 6) for their effort! The students looked fantastic in their house colours and we were very impressed with their positive attitude towards the day. Some were surprised by how well they ran, while others simply couldn't believe that they completed the distance. Thank you to our Year 6 student leaders for assisting with the junior school and middle school. They ran with, and encouraged, many of our younger runners and made them feel more comfortable.



## **School Arrival**

We have noticed that a number of children have been arriving at school well before 8:45am, whether they are walking/riding to school or being dropped off. A reminder that students should not be arriving at school before 8.45am in the morning. Students are not supervised before this time each day. Supervision begins from 8:45am. ## **Rapid Antigen tests**

The Victorian Government has announced it is extending the rapid antigen test (RAT) screening program for the first 4 weeks of Term 2. We will send these home before the end of the term.

The screening recommendations will remain the same next term for students (recommended to test at home twice a week).

## **ANZAC Day**

This year, the ANZAC day public holiday falls on Monday 25<sup>th</sup> April. ANZAC Day is a time to acknowledge those who have passed in service to our nations and to reflect on how that sacrifice has contributed to what and who we are as a nation today. This year our School Captains (Mason and Amelia) will be laying a wreath at the 6am Dawn service at Memorial Park. We will also be walking in the 9:30am Parade. If you would like your child to March with Mrs Peters, Mrs Webb and myself we will be assembling out the front of the council offices (opposite DOC restaurant) around 9:15am on Monday where we will march to Memorial Park (Barkly Street).

## **Bike Shed**

Parents please note that the school bike shed is only locked during the day - whilst our students are in class. It is unlocked just before the end of school so that students can collect their bikes/scooters. The

## Balnarring Beach Excursion




