## Osborne Big Freeze - MND Fundraiser

This year, some of the staff (including myself) will be doing the Big Freeze at Osborne in support of raising fund for Motor Neurone Disease (MND). Motor neurone disease is a life-shortening disease that progressively damages parts of the nervous system. People with motor neurone disease (MND) experience muscle weakness. This can cause problems with mobility, breathing, swallowing and managing daily tasks. Unfortunately, it has no cure at the moment. Every penny we raise will fund vital research to help us find a cure, and help support people living with MND now.

Each week at assembly, l'll be pulling out a new teacher's name to join me on Friday $9^{\text {th }}$ June at a special assembly for this important cause. I'll even be asking some of our Year 6 students if they would also like to participate. If you haven't seen a Big Freeze event it involves participants dressing up in character and then sliding into freezing water or having buckets of water and ice tipped on them. While this will be very uncomfortable, it pales into significance with what people with MND have to endure.

In the weeks leading up to the event will have a fundraising day and will also be selling Big Freeze merchandise.

Once processed, items will be sent out to classrooms. Book Club will usually be given out early in the week and orders must be submitted via LOOP by the following week (7 days to submit all orders). Online orders to be made by $10^{\text {th }}$ May 2023
Our school receives additional information about books on offer, so if you are unsure about the suitability of a book for your child please ask and we can advise you. Our school receives free points to purchase reading rewards for our treasure chest in the library. Children are rewarded for consistent reading and borrowing awards which are given out at assembly.
Please remember, there is no obligation to order, the decision is yours. Scholastic endeavours to encourage a love of reading by giving children the opportunity to choose their own books and build a home library so that family reading becomes a rewarding part of their lives.

Blended/stepfamilies can be wonderful, loving and happy for lots of people. But some find the complexity of blended families challenging.
