### **Building works update**

Yesterday, we received an updated completion timeline for the Gallery Building Project between the Year 2 and 3 portables. The architect informed the school that there will unfortunately be a delay due to the manufacturing of the windows. The build is now estimated to be completed by the end of Term 2. Unfortunately, this timeline is out of our hands. We understand that the additional delay is not ideal, and we once again thank everyone for their patience.

#### **School review**

As part of the improvement cycle, each Victorian government school undertakes a review every four years. The school leadership completes a comprehensive self-evaluation against past goals, KIS and targets. The review evaluates the school's strengths, areas for improvement and the impact of its improvement efforts.

Our school review began on Monday with the Panel Validation Day which involve students, teachers, and community members. It's a great opportunity to celebrate the successes but also reflect on areas for improvement. The following week will involve fieldwork days. During this time, the panel will be speaking to staff, students, and parents. These discussions will be informal chats in small groups.

At the end of the review, a new four-year school strategic plan is created and endorsed by the school community.

As part of this review, we are seeking feedback from parents. The review panel will meet with a parent group onsite to gain feedback.
