Impact of late arrival

We all run late sometimes. For your child, arriving late to school occasionally won't cause major disruption. Inevitably chronic lateness eventually takes its toll on a child's overall educational experience. Students depend on the structure of the day. When students are repeatedly late, these routines are disrupted. Children who are often late have trouble settling in and mastering routines. In many classrooms, particularly at the primary level, morning routines are critical to daily lessons. Warm-up activities may introduce topics that will be learned later in the day, or review work offers students an opportunity to review previously learned skills. This has a serious impact on their success across all learning areas.

Education Week!



A fabulous, fun filled time was had by all at our open afternoon on Friday 19th of May. Visitors were greeted at the gate by some of our Year 6 leaders then taken on a tour of our school. Grandparents, parents and special friends took the opportunity to keep our Year 6 leaders on their toes with a wide variety of questions and comments. Once directed to their child's classroom the visitors were engaged in an assortment of activities including Kahoot, Wordle, Uno and math games in Year 6. Year 5 students shared their writing pieces with their special guests. Visitors were challenged with problem solving activities in Year 4 along with some old-fashioned games like marbles and connect four. In year 3, they played monster math games and completed an AFL foot activity. With a focus on the education week theme 'Active Learners' the junior students warmed up by acting like playdough moving their bodies into interesting shapes. Afterwards, they went back to their classrooms to

engage in hands-on activities including shape making, word building and spelling noughts and crosses. A fantastic afternoon for all involved!



HOW CAN I HELP MY CHILD AT HOME WITH NUMERACY?

This article focusses on how we can best support our child's understanding and confidence in Numeracy with some simple ideas for home.

To best support your child's learning in Numeracy there are a variety of simple, inexpensive and fun games and activities which increase their understanding, confidence and automaticity of number facts. For example, $7+3=10$, $4+5=9$ etc.



Students enjoy playing card and dice games to improve their accuracy and speed in recalling number facts in addition and subtraction as well as their Times Tables. To find some games to play you can go to this site: <https://www.youtube.com/channel/UC-F-4l1fKSd3mZCjslzuukA>

Games such as hopscotch with numbers and equations chalked into the squares can make learning both fun and active.

"Guess my number", providing support with a number chart and clues, such as I am smaller than 20, but bigger than 9 and I am an odd number. I have a 5 in the ones. These simple, quick activities help to develop skill and understanding in a fun way.

When teaching the Times Tables a set sequence is taught throughout the school. This provides links and strategies between the times tables.

The sequence is as follows 1, 5, 10, 2, 4, 3, 6, 9, 8, 11, 7, 12. For example, the 2 times table is taught before the 4 times tables to assist with understanding the doubles and halving strategies.

There are many fun activities to engage your child in simple ways to enrich and consolidate their learning at home.


