Areas for Improvement at Osborne

In the last newsletter, I presented some of the data that was very positive with our school being ranked above liked schools in all performance categories.

Although we are pleased with these results, we are constantly reflecting and working on areas for improvement. Some areas that we have identified and are continuing to work on are:

- Consistent Wellbeing approach across the school.
- Strengthen student recall of basic number facts.
- Continue extending and challenging particular groups of students.
- Develop students' sentence cohesion and how this impacts their writing.
- Targeted intervention and support for students deemed at risk in Literacy and Numeracy.
- Develop PLC structures throughout the school.
- Unpack the new NAPLAN proficiency levels.
- Continue to provide opportunities for students to develop their interests through extra-curricular activities including lunchtime clubs, Blue Court sport etc.
- Maximise the school's new learning spaces.

Student-led conferences

'Student-Led Conferences' are once again being held across all year levels at Osborne this week. As the name implies the conference is student led. Through this process the students are encouraged to take responsibility for their own learning.

I've dropped into a couple of these conferences, and I'm amazed at our students' abilities to talk in depth about their learning (where they are at and what is the next step in their learning). Thank you to all of the parents that booked a time. We had approximately 90% of parents book a conference.

Parking along Dunns Road pick up area

There is a growing concern in our community in regard to the pickup area near our Dunns Road exit. Some parents have been parking and leaving their cars in the designated Kiss and Go zone. The Kiss and Go zone is intended for quick and efficient drop-off and pick-up of students. Please refrain from parking and leaving your vehicle unattended in this area. It is an essential component of our school's traffic management system, designed to facilitate a smooth flow of vehicles during these times.

Some parents have also been doing U-turns to skip the line of cars that are waiting for a free car park. This is unsafe and disrupts the flow of traffic, not to mention unfair for parents that have been waiting for a park.

Please understand that these guidelines are put in place for the safety and well-being of our students, staff, and all visitors. By adhering to the guidelines set for this area, we can ensure the safety of our children and the convenience of everyone involved.

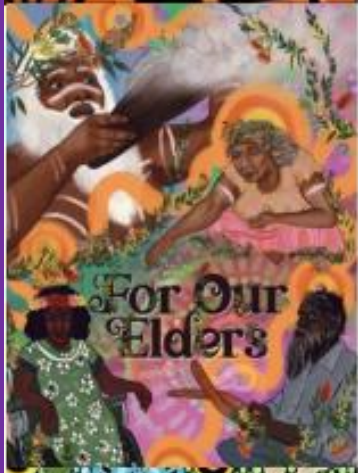




CELEBRATE NAIDOC WEEK
