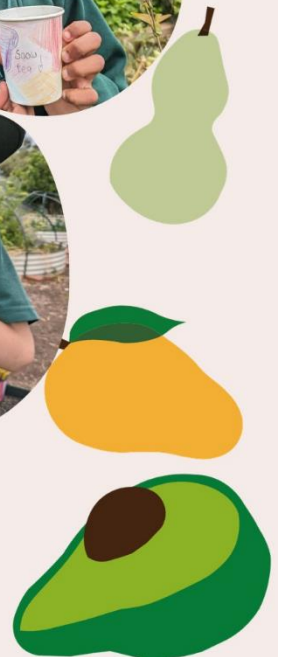

This term, OPS students participated in Real World Maths. The purpose was to take a break from the standard daily maths lesson and demonstrate to students that maths is everywhere. The children participated in various indoor and outdoor challenges, crafts and activities. Such as Finska, exploring time, place value bean bag toss, measuring Usain Bolt's stride (it was 2.44m - he ran the 100m in 9.58 seconds!), learning capacity, bathroom designs and more! 2024 Instrumental Program

New Student expression of interest.

(If your child is on a waiting list from 2023 you DO NOT need to fill in this form – you will be contacted when a place opens up).

There are available places for singing from year 2 onwards from the beginning of 2024.

We look forward to welcoming new students to our Instrumental Program at Osborne Primary School (OPS) next year.

OPS's Instrumental Program is a parent funded, optional, extra curricula activity offered to students.

2024 Fees - \$35 per lesson each week. (\$350 per term).

The Instrumental team consists of two experienced instructors:

- Sean Barley – piano, guitar, drums, bass, and ukulele.
- Leanne Rault – singing and guitar.

Students attend privately paid lessons and are taught 1 on 1 in the instrumental rooms in the school gym. This lesson may be during class time, recess, or lunchtime. The Instrumental instructors follow the guidelines of the Child Safe legislation to ensure the schools Child Safety Policy is followed. Once your child has a place in the program parents will need to sign a form and return it to the Performing Art room to indicate you are aware of the arrangements for the instrumental program.

If you wish to sign your child up to learn an instrument and allow them to benefit the fun and enjoyment of playing music while it develops their cognitive thinking then please fill out the form below, hand it into the Performing Arts Room and the instructor will be in contact with you. If they become full, then your child will go on a waiting list.
